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The Mental Health and Recovery Board

(MHRB) is a public agency organized under Chapter 340 of the Ohio Revised Code and created to establish a unified system of mental health and addiction recovery services for citizens of Belmont, Harrison and Monroe Counties.

The Mental Health and Recovery Board (MHRB) is a branch of county government which is authorized and defined in the Ohio Revised Code, Section 340. It was created to establish a unified system of mental health and addiction recovery services for citizens of Belmont, Harrison and Monroe Counties. County boards do not provide direct clinical services, but rather purchase those services, primarily from local community agencies.

County boards are responsible to determine local needs, develop a community plan, set priorities, direct resources and monitor services in their district. This provides an opportunity to create integrated systems of care that are most responsive to the needs and desires of the local citizens. This is important because characteristics of counties vary widely and there is a mix of urban, suburban and rural areas in Ohio that makes a “one-size-fits-all” approach particularly ineffective.

Data usage while texting Crisis Text Line is free and the number will not appear on a phone bill with the mobile service carrier. An algorithm reviews text for severity and messages that are determined to be from someone at imminent risk are placed at the top of the queue.

- A. Ensuring the availability of comprehensive treatment and rehabilitation services to persons and significant others affected, and
- B. Educating and involving the community in the prevention of all forms of chemical abuse and dependency.

Because these issues often coexist with mental health issues, the agency expanded its services to include individuals with various mental illness diagnoses.

Long-term sobriety requires ongoing, multi-disciplinary treatment and a strong support network. Family Recovery Center provides care and support through powerful, convenient programs that help clients learn to fully integrate recovery in their day-to-day lifestyle.

At this time, TVN is the only organization in the state to be certified in the Neurosequential Model of Therapeutics and one of only eight internationally implementing NMT and training other organizations to use it.
